Jess Posner (AKA Jessica Posner) is a queer feminist transdisciplinary artist, writer, curator, organizer, educator, and energy worker. Posner models resilience and radical vulnerability as means for healing the self, body, and spirit. Her work gently weaponizes the slippery, transformative poetics of femininity and queerness as means towards an embodied personal, political, material, and spiritual liberation. Posner's experimental performances, films, videos, sculptures, texts, and social practice projects intertwine and illuminate connections between theory, practice, technique, and the social. Currently based in Syracuse, NY; Posner teaches university courses in art and writing; organizes a bimonthly inclusive women's event at a queer bar; and curates the biannual *FEELINGS: A Feminist Art Video and Film Festival*.
